Turnout Pushes Results

Landslide wins for Obama, Adams

The largest voter turnout in a primary election since 1976 gave Portland City Commissioner Sam Adams more than 58 percent support for mayor to defeat business-minded Sho Dozono without a runoff.

Sen. Barack Obama also captured a landslide 65 percent of Democrats in the presidential primary against Sen. Hillary Clinton.

In other city council races, Nick Fish and Randy Leonard coasted to victories, but Amanda Fritz's nearly 43 percent wasn't quite enough to win outright. This November Fritz will face north Portland's Ethos Music Center founder Charles Lewis, whose 12 percent barely edged out John Branam, the African-American development director of Portland

Public Schools, and Jeff Bissonette, a north Portlander who crusaded against utility fraud.

Another close race concluded for House District 45 of northeast Portland and Parkrose: Portland Community College professor Michael Dembrow edged out Cyreena Boston, an African American health-disparities activist, by less than 1,000 votes.

Super Delegate Endorses Obama

Portland super delegate Jenny Greenleaf endorsed U.S. Sen. Barack Obama, D-III, Friday for the Democratic nomination for president. Greenleaf is a Democratic Party Committeewoman.

"The voters of Oregon have spoken, and I have listened," she said. "Sen. Obama has the vision and leadership ability to move this country forward and to undo the damage done by the Bush administration. I am proud to support him in this endeavor."

Oregon is home to 12 of the so-called super delegates. Obama now has 4 of those and Sen. Hillary Clinton 2. Uncommitted super delegates Senator Ron Wyden and Secretary of State Bill Bradbury may throw their support in the next few weeks.

The Democratic Party says the results from Oregon's presidential primary election give Obama 21 pledged delegates to Clinton's 21.

Sheriff Giusto to Retire July 1

(AP) — Sheriff Bernie Giusto of Multnomah County plans to resign July 1.

His announcement Thursday came a little more than a week after a police standards committee recommended he be stripped of his badge because of evidence he lied nearly 20 years ago when he told his Oregon State Police

supervisors he wasn't having an affair with the wife of then-Gov. Neil Goldschmidt.

Giusto was a member of the governor's security detail at the time.

The committee also determined that Giusto lied earlier this year when he said in a sworn statement that he didn't remember ever

being confronted by his supervisors about his relationship with Margie Goldschmidt.

Lying violates the state's moral fitness standard required of all police officers.

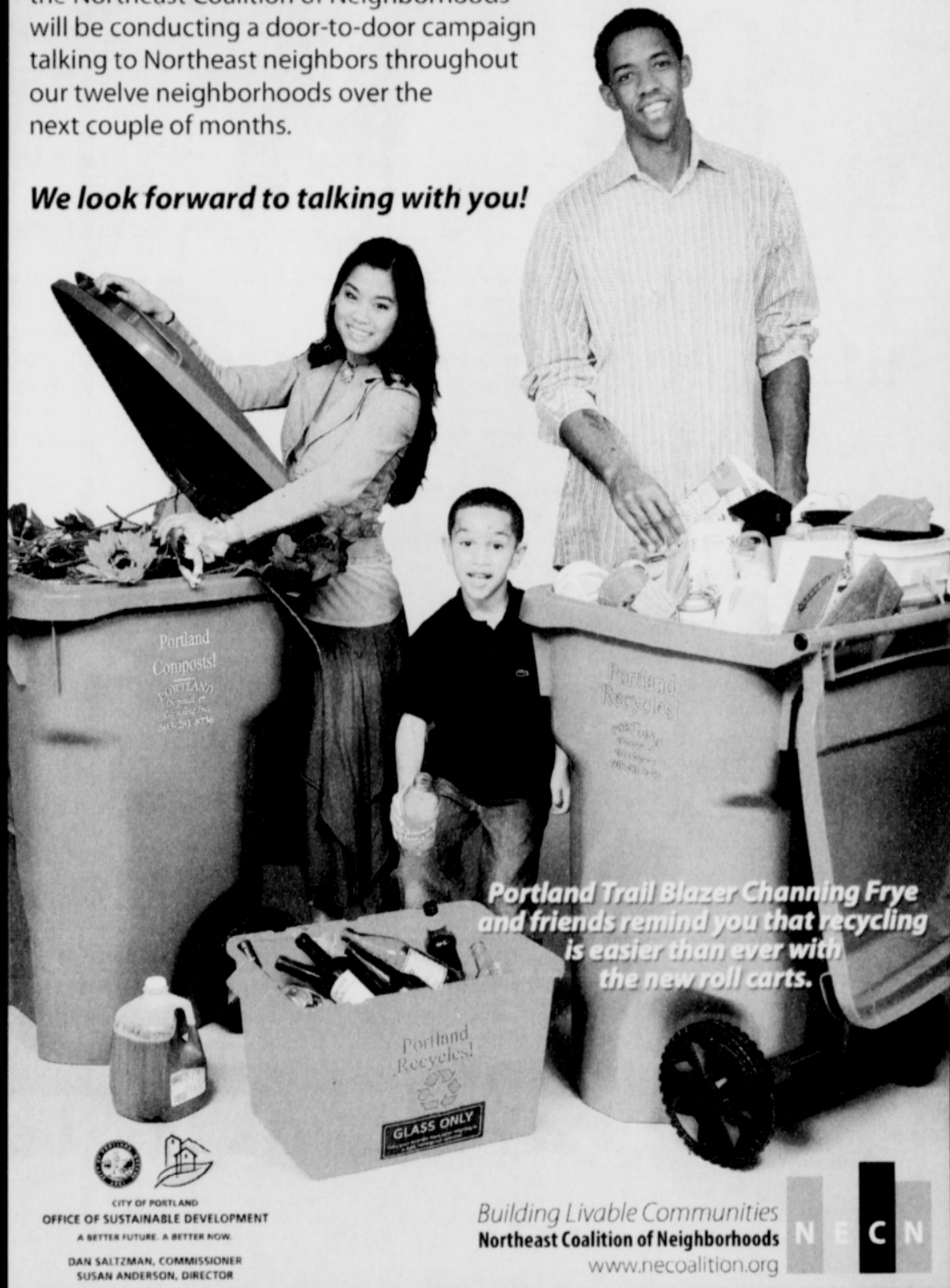
