# Habib Koite at the Oregon Zoo

World-class artist brings sounds of West Africa to Portland

should feel right at home, as West cert lawn to their exhibit in the zoo's Bamba du Jon swamp. World-class music albums of 2007. Koité is revered as a griot, an important class of West African musician-bards. But unlike many other griots, Koité emphasizes soft, cadenced melodies, using a form he created called danssa-doso. "Danssa" is a rhythm popular to his native city of Keyes, and "doso" is one of the most potent and ancient musical traditions of Mali.

Koité's near-universal appeal led his band, Bamada, bring their rich to his 2002 collaboration with Bonnie Raitt on her album "Silver Lining." Such partnerships have earned Koité a reputation as a forward-thinker. "With one foot in the past and the other in the future," noted National Geographic, "Habib Koité is an artist for a generation that has witnessed the breaking down of cultural barriers.'

"Habib Koité can incorporate ancient themes into modern music," said Swan.

# Vintage Black Cinema Stamps go on Sale

Vintage movie posters highlighting various facets of the African-American cultural experience, as represented in early film, are returning to postage stamps as the U.S. Postal Service issues the Vintage Black Cinema stamps. The 42-











cent commemorative First-Class stamps were dedicated July 16 at the Newark, N.J., Museum during the Black Film Festival and went on sale nationwide that day. The Vintage Black Cinema souvenir sheet includes 20 stamps in four rows with five different commemorative stamps featuring posters advertising movies produced for African-American audiences prior to 1950. Stamp art director and designer Carl T. Hermann of Carlsbad, Calif., intended to evoke a strip of film with perforations, or sprocket holes, running down the left and right edges.
