Free lineup builds community


Looking for free family activities this summer? Want to enjoy the beauty of your own neighborhood?

Marquis Soudamire of Abstract Visionz is presenting a series of movies of particular interest in north and northeast Portland.








Jazz Legend 'Little Giant' Remembered

(AP) -- Jazz tenor saxophonist Johnny Griffin, who played alongside such luminaries as Lionel Hampton, Art Blakey and Thelonius Monk, is being remembered after his death last Friday in France. He was 80.

Nicknamed the Little Giant, Griffin studied music at the DuSable High School in his native Chicago, and joined vibes star Hampton's orchestra in 1945 before leaving with trumpeter Joe Morris to join the latter's own band.

Throughout the 1950s, he played with a variety of combos, including Art Blakey's Jazz Messengers.

He also played alongside cornetist Nat Adderley and recorded with John Coltrane. The fruits of is perhaps best remembered, "A Blowin' Session.'
