

Mr. Penix was born on Jan. 6, 1909 in Bearden, Arkansas. He has been a resident of Portland for 65 years.

He came to Portland during World War II

to work in the shipyards. He lived in Vanport, until the flood of 1948. In the early sixties he operated the Parkway grocery store on Williams Avenue for 10 years, after that he worked the meat counter at Leonard's store on North Mississippi Avenue.

Mr. Penix retired in his late 80's
