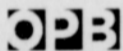

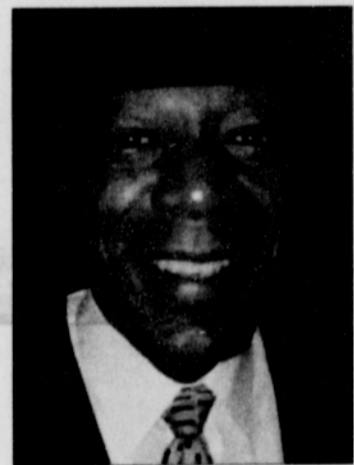

Charles Jordan, former City of Portland Commissioner and former Director of Portland Bureau of Parks and Recreation is this year's keynote speaker at the Third Annual Drum Major Ecumenical Service presented by Vancouver Avenue First Baptist Church, 3138 N. Vancouver Ave.

## TriMet Adjusts Service for MLK Holiday

TriMet will modify its bus and MAX schedule for the Martin Luther King Jr. holiday on Monday, Jan. 19, to match ridership demand.

The transit agency carries more riders on the MLK holiday than any other holiday, so the agency is providing more service than a typical holiday/

Sunday schedule.

Based on last year's figures, ridership is anticipated to be approximately two-thirds of a normal weekday.

The special modifications mean MAX will run on a Saturday schedule, 59 heavily-traveled bus lines will run on weekday schedules,

18 bus routes will run on Saturday schedules and 12 of 20 weekday rush-hour lines will be canceled, including the five lines serving Marquam Hill.
