Oregon's 150th Birthday Bash

The classical music group Fear No Music and other Oregon composers have arranged a series of concerts in Portland, Eugene and Salem as part of Oregon's 150th anniversary of statehood. Some modern dance and ballet will also be mixed in.

The first performance will take place on Friday, Feb. 13 at Disjecta, 8371 N. Interstate Ave., followed by concerts in at the University of Oregon in Eugene on Tuesday, Feb. 17 and at Willamette University in Salem on Thursday, Feb. 19.

First produced in 1987, Frankie and Johnny in the Clair de Lune is a much beloved romantic comedy (which has been seen throughout the U.S. and was adapted into a movie in 1991) focusing on two rather ordinary people: the dreamer and romantic Johnny and the hard edged realist Frankie.

The central question in this play, as in all romantic comedy, is can these two people with all their differences and all their idiosyncrasies somehow swept together by fate find happiness together?

The play is presented by CoHo Productions and coproduced and directed by veteran Portland theatre artist Tony Sonera. The production does contain adult language, themes, and nudity.




