The 12th annual Portland Clowns Without Borders Benefit Show will take place Friday, March 20 at 7:30 p.m. at the Da Vinci Middle School Theater, 2508 N.E. Everett St.

The performance will feature some of the best new vaudeville and modern circus acts and raise donations to fund two Portland-led Clowns Without Borders humanitarian projects in Haiti.

This is an annual highlight of Portland's variety theater/new circus scene featuring Portland's top jugglers, acrobats, eccentric comedians, and clowns – including The Bellini Twins, as seen recently on the Jay Leno show.

Portland has for 11 years been arguably the strongest center for Clowns Without Borders of any city in the U.S.
