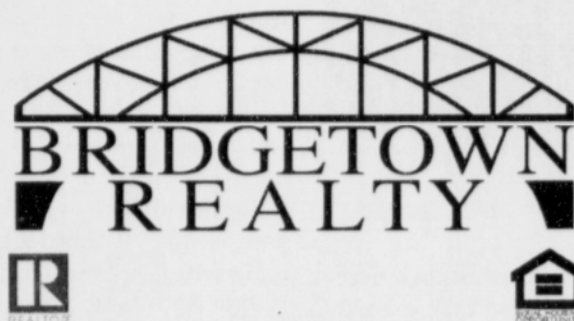

the parking lot that's almost bigger than the flashing "Twelve 22" sign.

The most recent efforts seem to be paying off.

According to police records, there hasn't been a single incident this year.

Kay Newell, who is on the Boise Neighborhood Association's board, said in an e-mail exchange that the bar has had problems in the past, but went on to say that Van "is willing to do what he needs to make the business a positive entertainment spot for the commu-

nity."

"I think he has a fair chance," said Thomas Boothe, who sold Van the bar, of his efforts to put it on the right path. He said that Van had no previous experience managing a bar, which has caused him to stumble.

Van isn't just focusing on security; he wants to change the feel of the bar. He envisions a community space where people can celebrate special events, hold meetings, network, take in a band, or just relax. He's put in flat screen televisions for the Blazer's games, started booking bands, and will continue to offer a menu full of

staple bar food.

On a Saturday night the flashy sign for Twelve 22 can be seen blocks away. Inside, the room is cast in a red light. Bob Marley posters are spread sporadically on the walls.

The door man, wearing costume military garb, amiably checks IDs. Van sits by his side, with a steely gaze directed at the door. He occasionally gets up and circles the bar, greeting customers. The bar's clientele, some with gray dreadlocks some with sagging pants, play pool, chat it up or shake their butts on the dance floor to tunes ranging from Marvin

Gaye to 50 Cent.

At one point in the evening two uniformed police officers enter the premises and stand like statues near the pool table. Their presence fazes no one.

For Van, saving the bar is less about his livelihood and more about preserving a historic community space.

"There are limited social outlets in the community, especially African-American owned," said Van, who said that the grandparents of some of his customers used to frequent the spot. "I'm just carrying on a tradition. It's with my flavor now."

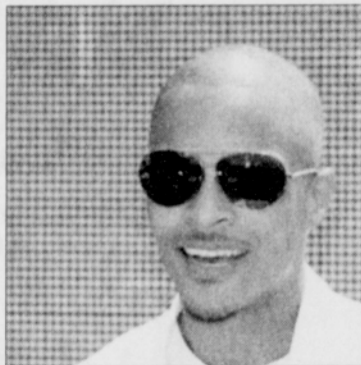
Rapper Sentenced for Guns

(AP)-- A judge sentenced Rapper T.I. to one year and a day behind bars on federal weapons charges on Friday.

The 28-year-old rapper, whose real name is Clifford Harris, pleaded guilty last March after he was arrested in 2007, attempting to buy unregistered machine guns and silencers.

He will have between 30 and 60 days to report to prison. Harris already has completed about 1,000 hours of community service and has warned youths about the pitfalls of guns, drugs, violence. He will need to complete 470 additional hours.

"Everything I learned was through trial and error," Harris also told the judge. "I've learned lessons in my life to put in my music so people won't make the same mis-



T.I. takes as I."

At Friday's hearing, former United Nations Ambassador Andrew Young spoke on Harris' behalf.

T.I. said fear was the reason he tried to buy the guns. His best friend, Philant Johnson, was murdered following a post-performance party in Cincinnati in 2006.
