




## **Carolina Cruises to NCAA Title**

It was a calculated march, and behind the unrelenting play of Tyler Hansbrough, Wayne Ellington and Ty Lawson, the Tar Heels stomped out Michigan State's inspirational run Monday night with an 89-72 blowout that wasn't that close. "I felt like it was fitting for us to do what this group just accomplished," coach Roy Williams said.




