Teen Murder Case Resolved

Killer admits guilt during trial

(AP) -- A Portland teenager on trial last week for the fatal shooting of a Benson High School freshman decided to plead guilty after the first witness identified him as the killer. Joseph E. Allen, 18, was sen-

tenced to 18 years in prison. Allen was a 16-year-old gang

member when he shot Davonte Lightfoot in the back of the head on a Sunday afternoon in January 2007 in front of a community center on North Killingsworth Street.

Lightfoot wasn't in a gang, but his group of friends may have had a run-in with Allen's friends in the past, Prosecutor

Charles Sparks said.

Allen apologized to Lightfoot's mother, who was at her son's side when he was declared dead at a Portland hospital five hours after the shoot-

"It's just one of those sad cases-a 16-year-old shooting a 14-year-old. ... They're just kids," retired Portland police Detective Lynn Courtney, who investigated the crime.

Lightfoot, who was 5 feet tall, had excelled as a youngster, even skipping a grade in elementary school. He started hanging with the wrong crowd, however, and had been on probation since June 2005 after admitting to possessing a gun.

The following year he told a juvenile counselor that he armed himself because he feared

His mother, Tammorra Barnes, claims in a lawsuit against Multnomah County that Lightfoot went outside the range of his electronic monitoring anklet on Dec. 21, 2006, and that she repeatedly told the county that her son was breaking the rules and she wanted him detained. A prosecutor unsuccessfully tried to get a judge to lock him up, in part for his own safety. A few weeks later, the boy was dead.
