R&B Hall of Famer Dies

Tenor fronted the Flamingos and the Dells

(AP) -- John E. Carter, the R&B lead tenor and two-time inductee into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, is being remembered after his death on Friday at the age of 75.

"We have lost an incredible voice that graced two of the most significant vocal groups of all time," said Terry Stewart, president and CEO of the hall of fame. "As a member of both the Dells and the Flamingos, Johnny was one of a select few artists inducted twice into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame."

Carter, who was known for his falsetto, was the last surviving founding member of the Flamingos. The classic doo-wop group gained fame with such hits as "Golden Tears" and their reworking of the pop classic "I Only Have Eyes for You."

Carter left the Flamingos for the first time in 1957 to do military service, and left perma-

The Dells' 1954 breakout hit, "Oh What A Night," sold more than a million records when it was reissued in 1969 with Carter on falsetto lead. The Dells were also famous for "Stay in My Corner," one of the first R&B hits to run more than six minutes.

The group toured extensively with Dinah Washington and later with Ray Charles. The Dells also came to the attention of Quincy Jones, who coached them into a more eclectic vocal style, incorporating jazz, soul and Broadway sounds.

The Dells, consisting of Carter, baritone lead Marvin Junior, and backup singers Charles Barksdale, Michael McGill and Verne Allison, served as technical advisers on Robert Townsend's 1991 movie, "The Five Heartbeats," which was loosely based on their careers.

The Dells performed publicly for one of the last times in 2004, when they did an outdoor concert in downtown Chicago to celebrate their induction into the hall of fame.

The Flamingos were inducted in 2000.

nently in 1960 to join the Dells, which had been formed in the early 1950s by some of his high school friends from Harvey.

Stewart noted that the Dells were one of the longest-running R&B vocal groups. The quintet had no personnel changes after Carter replaced original lead tenor Johnny Funches.

Jackson Mom Supports Tribute

The King of Pop's mother said in a letter made public Monday that next month's global tribute for Michael Jackson in Vienna is "a wonderful idea" and an event that her son would have loved.

The Sept. 26 concert — being planned by Jackson's brother Jermaine — will take place in front of a 17th-century palace in the Austrian capital. The performers haven't been announced, but the event is expected to draw thousands of people.

"An event of this dimension not only keeps Michael's spirit alive, more than that: It gives millions of fans the opportunity to experience his music and celebrate the life of my son," Katherine Jackson wrote. "I am

sure Michael would love it." Michael Jackson died aged 50 on June 25.

Event promoter Georg Kindel has said the tribute was originally planned for London's Wembley Stadium on Aug. 29, which would have been Jackson's 51st birthday, but that Jermaine Jackson decided instead on Vienna. Austria is home to many castles, and Jermaine has said Vienna was chosen as the venue because his brother "loved castles."

Jackson's mother also reached out to fans, saying she was "overwhelmed by the worldwide love and support that my beloved son Michael has received over the past month."

Hip Hop at Fernhill Park

Emmaus Church hosts their first annual Hip-Hop in the Park on Sunday, Aug. 30 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at Fernhill Park, located on the corner of Northeast 37th Avenue and Ainsworth Street.

The concert will showcase several national recording artists, including Odd Thomas, Propaganda, and Theory Hazit -- all of whom have roots in Portland.

Organizers from Emmaus Church, which meets at 4046 N.E. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., noted that Portland's successful Concerts in the Park series rarely features hip-hop music.
