

Oregon Leader Fought for **Civil Rights**

Like King, Mark Hatfield envisioned a more equitable society



Oregon was one of the states that put the nation's first black president over the top in the 2008 Presidential Election, but the state wasn't always so progressive when it came to race relations.

When the state was founded in 1859, its constitution barred blacks from moving to the state.

Shortly after the Civil War, white southerners harboring racist views flocked to Oregon, electing politicians who cemented the status of black Oregonians as second-class citizens.

Up until the 1950s, racist public accommodation laws were common in the state, and ex-

cluded blacks from restaurants, hotels, parks, and other places.

It took the work of one of Oregon's most revered and most liberal Republican politicians to help get the law repealed, moving the state one step closer to the


