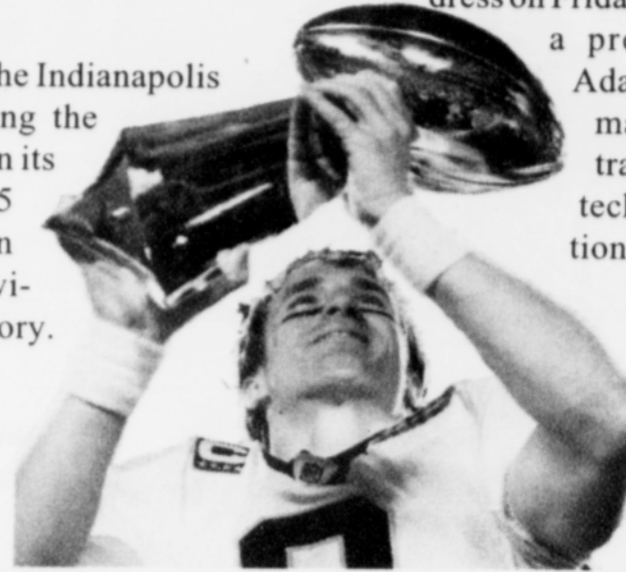
Funeral for Brothers

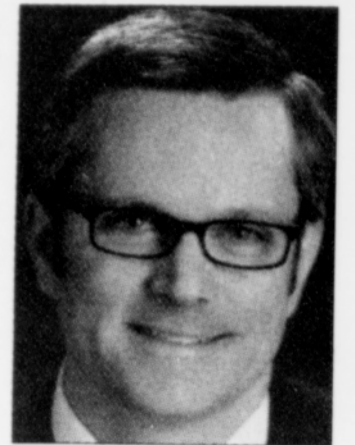
Redesign Moves Forward
