BLACK HISTORY

Journalism at its Best

Marvel Cooke's life story is an exceptional one, from her upper-class upbringing in a politically progressive Minnesota family to her adult life as a journalist, trade unionist, and political activist.

As a journalist, her landmark series, "The Bronx Slave Market," exposed the exploitation of black women by wealthy white women in New York.

Cooke also reported for a number of other publications including the NAACP's monthly publi-

cation, the Crisis, Amsterdam news, the New World Review and the Daily Compass, where she was the only African America on staff as well as the only female.

She fought for workers' rights as a member of the Newspaper Guild, and was called to testify before Senator Joseph McCarthy about her membership in the Communist Party.

"I didn't realize," she told Philly.com, "until much later looking back on my life, that I was

having such a great experience." Marvel Cooke was born in 1901 and died of leukemia at the age of 99.



Claudette Colvin

Before Rosa, there was Claudette

Claudette Colvin is a pioneer of the African American civil rights movement.

She disobeyed Montgomery, Alabama's bus segregation law on March 2, 1955, nine months before the better known Rosa Parks did, but her case was not publicized at the time by black leaders.

When told to get-up from her seat, Colvin refused and was forcibly taken off the bus by two police officers and taken to jail. At the time, local black leaders believed that Colvin's case was an appropriate one

to litigate all the way to the Supreme Court, as part of a broader effort to overturn segregation laws in the South.

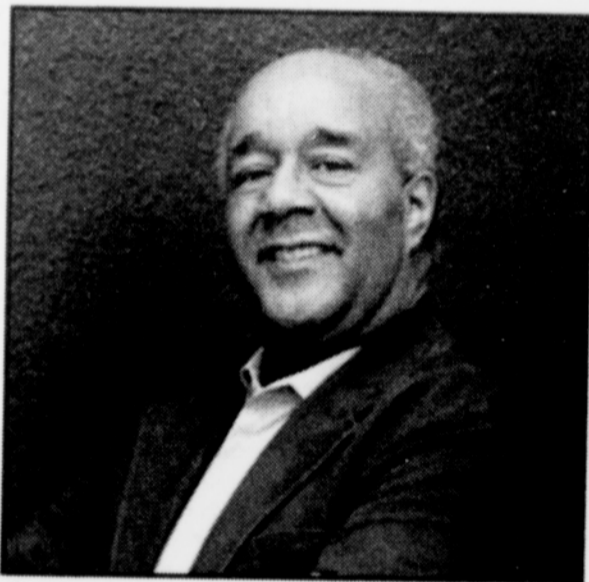
But because of her illegitimate pregnancy, local black leaders felt that her case wouldn't have a chance. So the decision was made to wait until they had a plaintiff who was more upstanding.

Colvin went to the Supreme Court to challenge the law that led to the end of segregation, and later commented that Rosa Parks was the right person to represent the civil rights battle.
