The grand jury also faulted officers for not communicating better during the incident, mentioning that Frashour wasn't kept up to date on negotiations with Campbell, who was reportedly suicidal from the death of his brother that day and acting erratically. Additionally, it questioned why police didn't bring in someone trained to deal with someone experiencing a crisis.

"If ever there were a case that required specially trained individuals and required handling with kid gloves, this was one," the letter read.

In response, Police Chief Rosie reau. Sizer released a statement reiterating that the incident was under investigation, and thanking the grand jury for their "commitment to this process."
