From 1960s Sit-ins to War


Combat pilot comes of age in Vietnam

What was the effect of going to war on an African American fighter pilot who lived through the 1960s sit-ins, Birmingham voter registration marches, the March on Washington, Black Panther Party shootouts, riots in Watts, Detroit and Newark, and the assassinations of President Kennedy, his brother Bobby, and Dr. King?

"I was conflicted, to say the least," recalls Brian H. Settles, author of "No Reason for Dying: A Reluctant Combat Pilot's Confession of Hypocrisy, Infidelity, and War" (BookSurge, 2009).

"Many of my contemporaries felt the war was unconscionable. And, for a 24 year old African American male, that seemed to be especially true. But I'd made a commitment for the opportunity to fly fighter jets, and it was my decision to honor that commitment, whatever the cost," Settles said. "I just didn't know how great the cost would be."




