Musicians Support JumpTown

With rekindling of cultural history

The Oregon Music Hall of Fame and the Portland Jazz Festival, guardians of the city's vast musical heritage, have endorsed a proposal to retrofit the Memorial Coliseum and Rose Quarter area with "Jump Town," an entertainment and sports district.

the eastside neighborhood's reputation as the city's premier gathering place of music, culture and community. The venue would advance Portland's music scene with about 150 free shows a year under a covered outdoor stage in the Rose Quarter plaza, according to proponents.

The neighborhood's indelible cultural history, chronicled in Robert Dietsche's book "JumpTown: The Golden Years of Portland Jazz, 1942-1957", served as

inspiration for the project's working title. Some of the most talented jazz artists who've ever played including Duke Ellington, Louis Armstrong and Thelonious Monk - showcased their talents at clubs on or near Williams Avenue.

"JumpTown brings a deliberate tie to an important part of Oregon's musical history," Marc Baker of the Oregon Music Hall of Fame said. "But the district is very forward-thinking and inclusive, which is the The two groups say the development would rekindle Portland way. We see a revitalized Rose Quarter as a way of sharing the neighborhood's history with students to get them excited about new musical talent to inspire the hall of fame inductees of tomorrow."

Currently, the Trail Blazers and Portland Winterhawks are partnering on the JumpTown plans with Memorial Coliseum designed to improve and enhance the building, while adding new amenities to draw daily community activity.
