

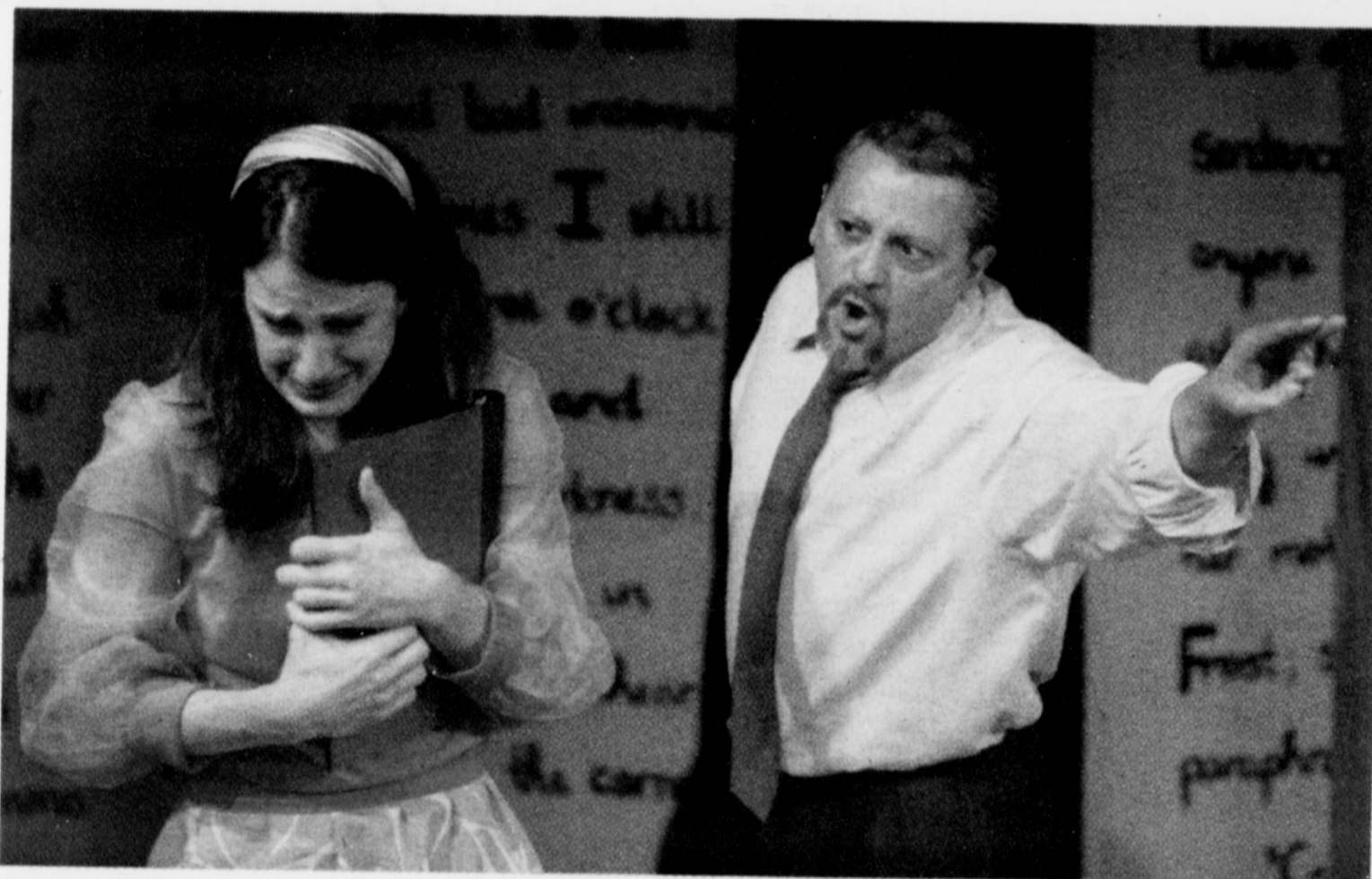

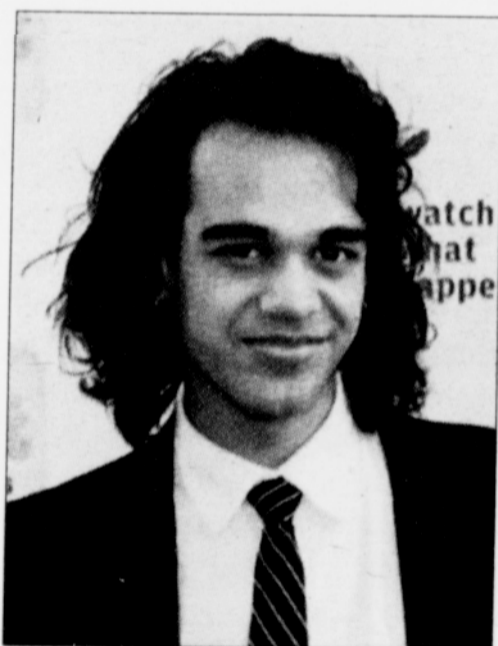

## 'Idol' Clocked at 110 mph

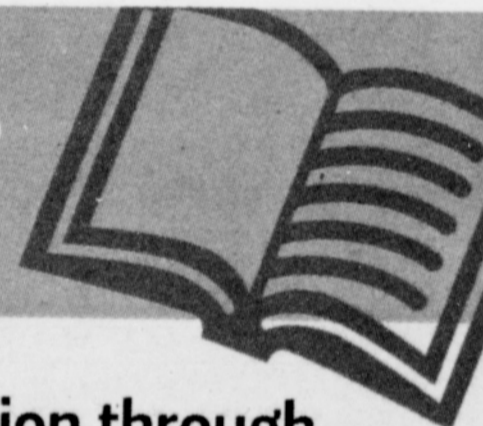
