300 trees added to four neighborhoods

Calling trees just as important as big sewer pipes, Portland City Commissioner Dan Saltzman helped Friends of Trees kickoff its largest Neighborhood Trees planting of the season.

Thanks to more than 200 volunteers who participated in the first-day-of-spring planting last month, 300 large street and yard trees were planted in the neighborhoods of Cully, Madison South, Rose City Park and Roseway—an over 100 percent increase from the number planted last year.

"It's important to have trees that capture storm water and keep it from getting in our sewer system—to beautify neighborhoods, enhance property values, and to provide cooling in the summer time," said Saltzman, who oversees the Bureau of Environmental Services, a Friends of Trees project partner via the Grey to Green Initiative.

Included in the volunteers figure were about a dozen employees from the Port of Portland, the sponsor of the community planting.

Sizer also announced that Portland has been selected as one of five cities for a national pilot project launched by the Bazelon Center for Mental Health Law to develop best practices for when police interact with the mentally fragile.

Fritz – who heads the city's office of Emergency Communications, which handles 911 calls -- said that it's currently standard practice to dispatch an officer to a situation involving a mentally ill person. She said that she would be looking into better integrating mental health services into the system.

The city also plans to launch a pilot program that will pair a mental health worker with a police officer, in hopes of producing better recommendations on how to enhance coordination between the police and mental health professionals.

Don Moore, of the local chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness, called the proposals positive steps. But he said they don't get to the root of a frayed mental health services system where people don't get the help they need and police become the first responders.

"Clearly what we're doing now doesn't work for anybody," Moore said.

The proposals drew fire from another group of mental health advocates, the Mental Health Association of Portland, which has been highly critical of the police and Saltzman's supervision of the bureau.

Cell Phone Crackdown

Millions of cellular telephone users across Mexico face the threat that their service will be cut off as soon as Wednesday for failing to register their telephone numbers with the government — a requirement aimed at curbing a rash of telephone extortion attempts.
