metro area," he said in a resignation letter Monday. "This type of distraction has created a rift among the members who support me and others who are embarrassed by my behavior and the Portland Police Association needs the type of unity we shared in November of 2009."

The date refers to a massive demonstration the police union held after Police Commissioner Dan Saltzman suspended Officer Christopher Humphreys for shooting a 12-year-

old girl with a beanbag shotgun at a Max station. Humphreys was also one of the officers involved in Chasse's death.

Saltzman withdrew the suspension after the union held a no confidence vote on him and Police Chief Rosie Sizer. The results of the vote were never released.

Westerman's resignation takes effect on June 19. In the meantime, he will be taking a leave of absence while Dave Dobler, the treasurer for the Portland Police Association takes the reigns as interim union president.
