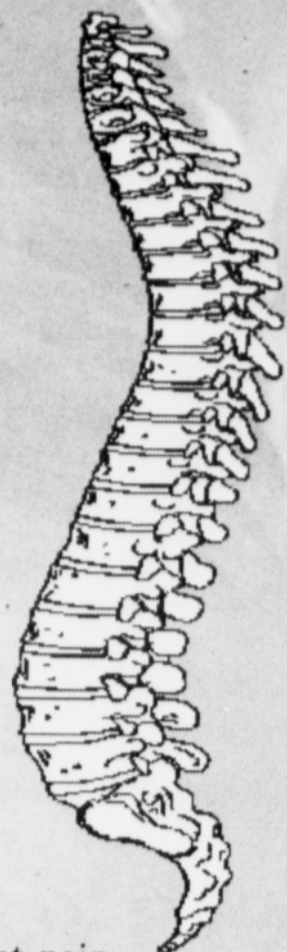

Stellar Lineup of Blues Talent 'Remember Me' tribute to Paul deLay

A sampling of Portland musical talent joins veteran blues artist and harmonica ace Charlie Musselwhite and his band in a benefit concert in memory of the late harmonica maestro Paul DeLay at the Aladdin Theater on Sunday, April 25 from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m.

All proceeds from the "Remember Me" performance will go toward music education scholarships at Ethos Music Center, a local non-profit serving youth in underserved communities.

The stellar lineup of local blues talent includes D.K. Stewart, Lloyd Jones, Jim Mesi, Linda Hornbuckle, Jimi Bott, Tahoe Jackson, Rick Welter and Franck "Paris Slim" Goldwasser, Arthur Moore and Tim O'Hare.

Former members of the Paul deLay Band: organists Louis Pain and Dover Weinberg; drummer Jeff Minnick; bassists Don Campbell and Dave Kahl; and guitarist Peter Dammann are also on the lineup.

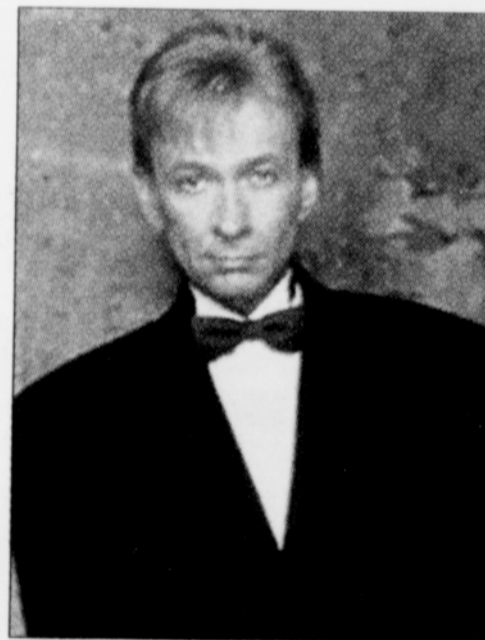
Tickets are \$20 in advance and \$25 at the door.

Jazz Legend at Jimmy Meks

Jazz legend Bobby Caldwell and the Portland Jazz Orchestra, featuring special guest Patrick Lamb will perform Caldwell's big band American Song Book for two shows on Friday, April 30 at Jimmy Meks, downtown.

Lamb has had the unique experience of touring Caldwell for last five years, both with his R&B show and big band show.

Caldwell has had a successful career with numerous solo releases, which have earned accolades far and wide. His songwriting skills have earned hits not only for him-

self, but also for well-known artists like Chicago, Boz Scaggs, Peter Cetera and Amy Grant, Neil Dia-

mond and Al Jarreau.

Bobby's timeless classic, "What You Won't Do For Love" has been recorded and sampled by more than 100 artists, including rendition by Boys II Men.

Since 2005, the artists and staff of Portland Jazz Orchestra have come together year-round to present top-caliber orchestral jazz. Born in Jackson, Miss., Lamb began paying his dues by playing roadhouse music as a teenager in the rural south when he heard the evocative sounds of James Brown, Stevie Wonder, Ray Charles, and Wilton Felder of the Crusaders.
