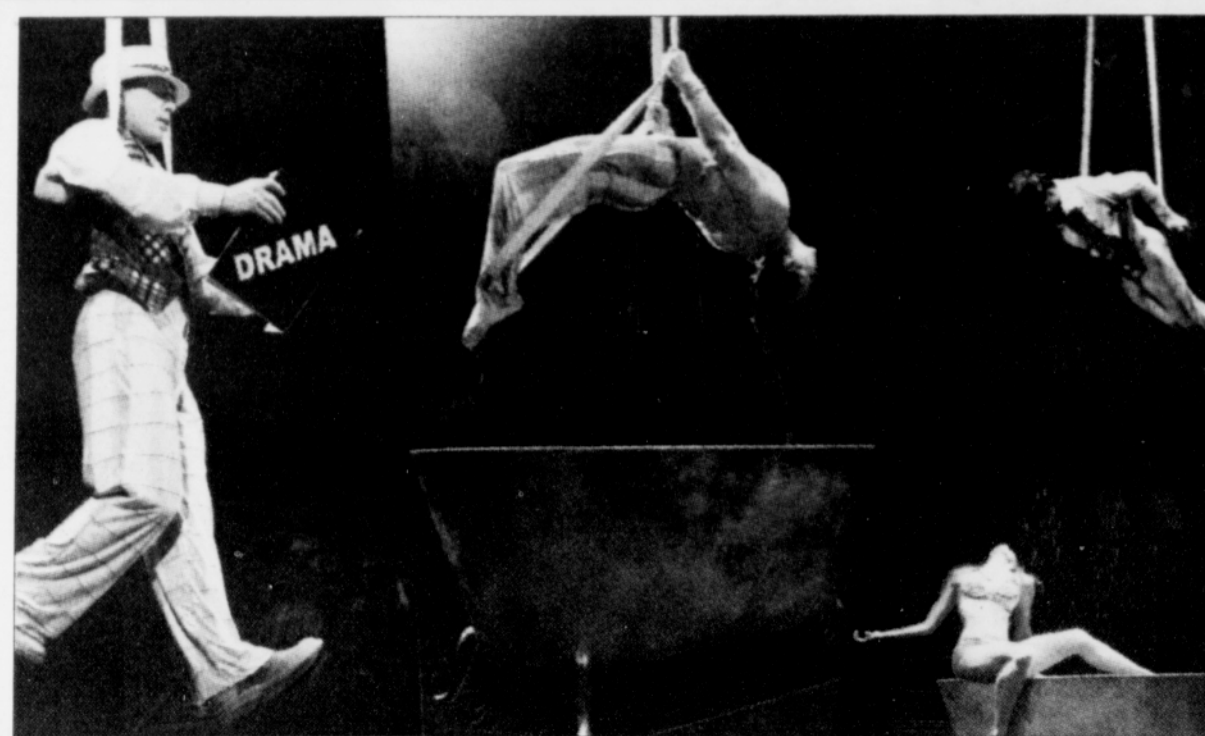
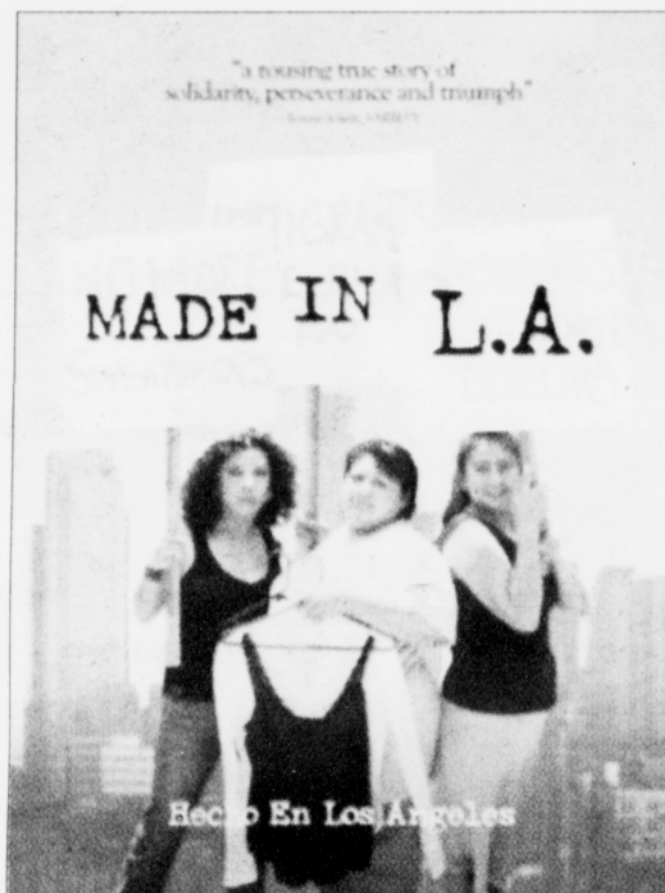
Human Rights Film at PSU

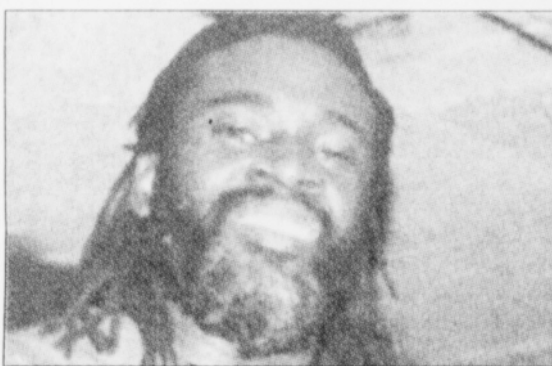
