


## Top Model Embraces Culture

It took Krista White, the Cycle 14 winner of "America's Next Top Model," almost halfway through the competition before she emerged as a front-runner. But when the 25-year-old from Pine Bluff, Ark., snagged her first win, she didn't let go. She rode that streak all the way to the May 12 finale.

That kind of determination isn't surprising when one considers that she first tried out for the TV reality show in 2003 and didn't stop until she made it.

White sees her win as an important step in a culture with very few representations of beautiful dark-skinned women like one of the icons she chose to emulate in the competition, Grace Jones.

"I just hate that there's nobody now," she told the Los Angeles Times. "I have to look so far back to find somebody I can use as an inspiration, who looks like me and I can channel."
