



No right thinking American can seriously argue that our nation is not better because of those actions.

Rand Paul can claim that his position is rooted not in racism, but in the worship of individual rights and the free market. But, society's role has always been to protect against abuses from the free market. What other atrocities would he allow in the name of private enterprise? And how does Paul's disdain for government interference square with his support for a Constitutional ban on a woman's right to choose?

Rand Paul may have won a primary a few weeks ago, but in my view he has lost his moral authority. Clearly, he is on the wrong side of history.


