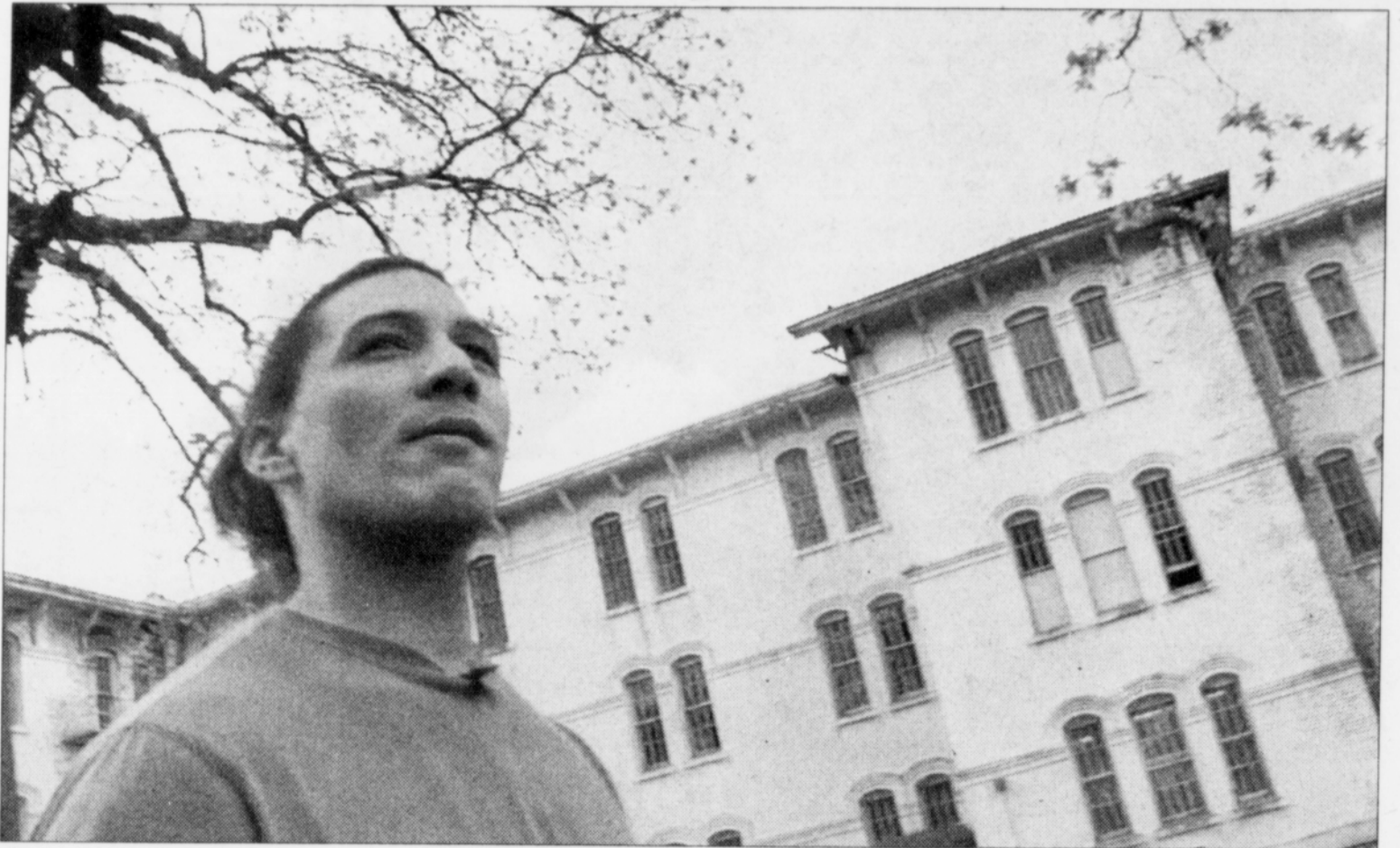

Dilemmas and the Criminally Insane

Going inside the state hospital

Documentary director Jan Haaken (Queen of Hearts: Community Therapists in Drag), a professor of psychology at Portland State University, returns to the Salem State Hospital, the location of One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest, and recounts the stories of real patients who live in this famous hospital for the criminally insane.

"Guilty Except for Insanity" tells a larger tale of broken lives and raggedy safety nets, and reveals the craziness of an American system where you have to commit a

crime to get psychiatric help as patients and staff try to make sense of each juncture in the road, from getting arrested and surviving the wards to reentering the community,

The documentary, which portrays the deeply human dilemmas behind media images of the criminally insane and probes the consequences of the American medical management of madness, will premier Sunday, June 27 at 7 p.m. at the Portland Art Museum and Northwest Film Center, 1219 S.W. Park Ave.

Oregon State Hospital has been the focus of intense controversy, including charges by the U.S. Department of Justice of massive civil

rights abuses of patients. This documentary tells a different side of the story - one that captures broader national trends in community mental health services.

Through footage shot at the hospital and interviews with patients and staff, the film shows how these patients had fallen deep into troubled waters before being caught in the raggedy "safety net" of jails, courts, and, finally, the state hospital. And in following the compelling stories of these patients, the documentary also tells a disturbing tale of political neglect and public paranoia concerning the mentally ill.

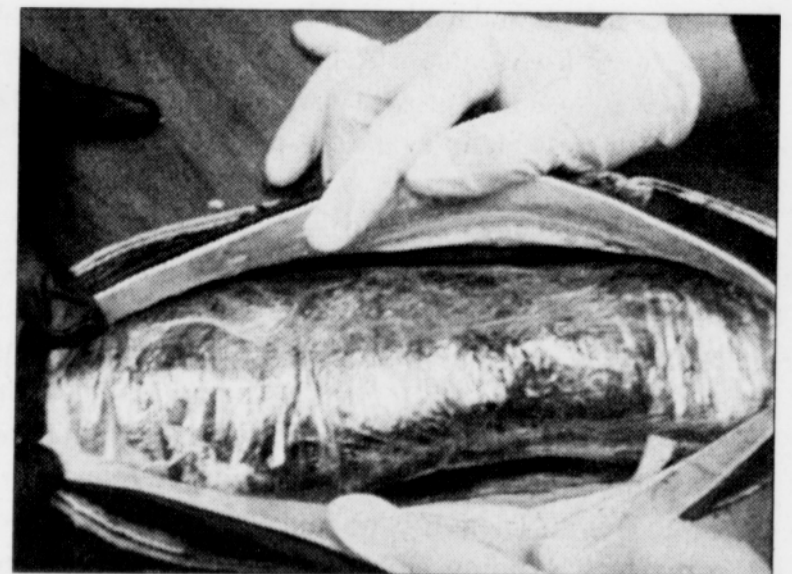
10 Pounds of Heroin Seized

Investigators from the Portland Police Bureau's Drugs and Vice Division made three arrests after carrying out search warrants which resulted in the seizure of 10 pounds of heroin and \$65,000 in cash.

The search warrants were served June 14 at 12238 S.E. Bush St. and 12045 S.E. Bush St. and at an apartment complex at 20433 S.E. Stark St. Seven vehicles associated with the heroin sales operation were also searched.

Police say the heroin was estimated to be worth between \$1 million and \$1.5 million and would supply approximately 72,500 sepa-

rate individual sales on the street. Investigators believe the heroin was driven here from Phoenix, Ariz. to be sold in the Portland area.



The three men charged were Sergio Aguilar Sahagun, 33, Roman Aguilar Rocha, 38, and Edgar Curiel Guzman, 29. All of the men were lodged in the downtown Multnomah County Jail.
