Zoo to Raise Second Tuesday Prices

Due to the slow economy, the Oregon Zoo will be reconfiguring some of its prices, but there are still ways to get some affordable entertainment.

The zoo's popular Second Tuesday discount program, offered on the second Tuesday of each month, will now go from \$2 to \$4. Children under two will continue to be admitted free.

However, people who take public

transportation, can take advantage of an additional discount program. Anyone who takes a TriMet bus or MAX to the zoo can shave off an additional \$1.50 off their \$4 admission.

Parties of 20 or more can still get a 20 percent discount when payment is made in one purchase.

Zoo officials say that the higher prices are in response to budgetary pressures.
