

Hawthorne Street Fair Sunday

The Hawthorne Street Fair will feature over 80 merchants, food and craft vendors, free movies, kid friendly festivities, live music, and local artists.

The 17th annual event is held along Southeast Hawthorne Boulevard, between 12th and 50th avenues, on Sunday, Aug. 15 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

This year the Hawthorne Boulevard Business Association is teaming up with Fish Emergency Services to facilitate a food donation drive in conjunction with the street fair.

Sunday Parkways, Portland's premier bicycle event will also cross Hawthorne again this year, drawing thousands of people to the festivities. Secure bicycle parking will be set up in the parking lot of Chase Bank, 3902 S.E. Hawthorne.
