Jazz," Brown has a career spanning over 40 years.

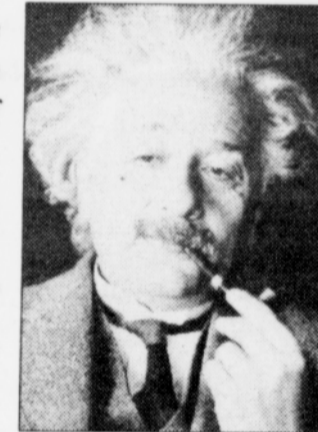
**Johnny Cash Tribute**—The Jubitz Ponderosa Lounge, 10350 N. Vancouver
