Prehistoric Predators -- A popular Oregon Zoo exhibit on dinosaurs with enormous animatronic creatures that roar, snarl and move with lifelike ferocity has been extended through Oct. 3. Visitors follow a trail through an ancient rain forest, surrounded by the realistic creatures.

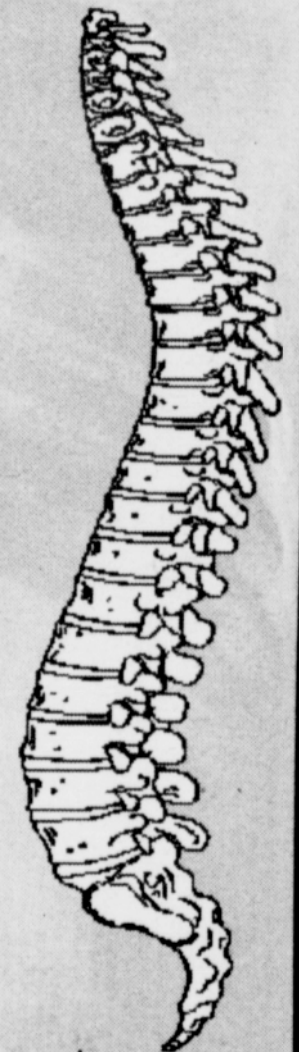
