In 1964, Hattie M. Porter became the first person to weave hair in the state of Oregon, so that she could do the hair of the kids in her neighborhood.

45 years later, Porter continues to offer authentic weaves that can't be done at home, at her salon, Broadway Hairweevers & Designers, 3516 N.E. 15th Ave.

As an African-American woman, she represents a crosssection of minorities, yet she says her business is open to all.

"The majority of my clients are about one-third white," she says.

Porter has worked in her current location for a quarter of a century.

"It's not as busy as it was about five years ago," she said, attributing the downtown to the economy, but she has plans to continue to work for as long as possible.
