## **UP Student starts** business as volunteer

Elle Hoxworth, a senior majoring in sociology and political cation -- doing the work you science at the University of Portland, is the first recipient of the room," Hoxworth said of her Molly Hightower Endowed Scholarship, given annually to a junior or senior with a strong devotion to faith and commitment to service.

Hoxworth, of Pasadena, Calif., recently returned from Kakamega, Kenya, where she started a business as a volunteer with the Western Education Advocacy and Empowerment Program. The program works with women and their families in western Kenya through a variety of programs. It also was her second trip as part of the university's new East Africa Initiative.

"It's a different kind of edulove and not sitting in a classsummer internship. "It's working with people, implementing programs, working on the fly."

The advocacy program offers vocational training in sewing skills for women as a core part of its programs in Kenya, and Hoxworth saw an opportunity to bring a fair income to these vulnerable women in the community. The women made placemats, napkins, pot holders, purses and bags out of African Kitenge material that are sold locally and abroad.
