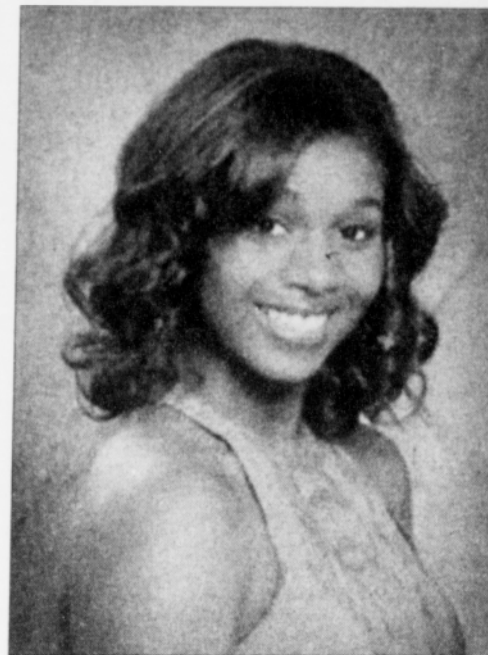
## Highland Haven Scholarship Banquet
