## Deputies Cleared in Shooting

Clackamas County Sheriff's deputies will not face criminal charges in the death of an elderly woman who died in July after she was shot by a stun gun.

Deputies used a stun gun to disarm 87-year-old Phyllis A. Owens of Boring as she bran-

dished what they believed was a semiautomatic handgun at a mobile home park.

The park manager had told dispatchers that Owens pulled out a pistol and threatened to shoot him.

After Owens collapsed, deputies determined she was carrying

a pellet gun.

In declining to bring any charges, Senior Deputy District Attorney Scott Healy says the deputies, believing Owens was a threat, would have been justified in shooting her, but tried a less-lethal measure.

## Reward Offered in MAX Beating

Witnesses said attack was unprovoked

The Portland Police Bureau, in cooperation with Crime Stoppers, is asking for your help in solving a violent assault that occurred June 6 at about 5:17 p.m. on a MAX train bound for the airport.

Authorities said a passenger was seated on the train looking out the window when another man began punching him in the head, knocking him to the floor, and then continued punching and kicking him.

The assault was so violent that the window behind the victim's head was shattered. Witnesses described the assault as completely unprovoked. The victim was transported by ambulance to an area hospital with numerous bumps and cuts on his face but did not suffer any broken bones or long-term damage.

The suspect fled the scene on

assault, the suspect was wearing a light gray hooded sweatshirt, gray sweatpants, and light-colored tennis shoes.

Crime Stoppers is offering a cash reward of up to \$1,000 for information, reported to Crime Stoppers, that leads to an arrest in this case or any unsolved felony crime. Callers can remain anonymous.

## Demand for Child ID Kits

The disappearance of missing 8-year-old Kyron Horman has led to an unprecedented demand for child ID kits.

According to Judy Hayes, the Oregon State Police Missing Children's Clearinghouse program manager, the demand is directly attributed to the ongoing national and local media coverage related to the missing Skyline Elementary student.

The ID kits, which are available in English and Spanish, have been distributed by the state police agency since 1999.

The kits take only a few minutes to fill out, are non-intrusive and contain valuable information, including a place for a photograph, medical information, personal information, DNA cheek swab sample, fingerprints, dental information and physical description.

Once completed, the kit can be sealed in a zip-lock bag and kept in an easily accessible, safe place.
