
Green Crafters Host Sale

Customers also will get to enjoy wine and snacks, and a 20 percent discount off of their entire purchase.

Trillium's 50 artisans make a wide range of products for everyone on a shopper's list including jewelry made from cast-off metal parts, vinyl records and bike tires; vintage-style aprons; handbags; wallets made from lawnchair webbing; sporty hats; etched glassware; garden décor; leather hair clips; pet toys and much more.
