Eminem Tops Grammy Nominations

Cee Lo competes for song of the year

(AP) -- When Eminem was first nominated for album of the year some 10 years ago for "The Marshall Mathers LP," it marked a milestone for the Grammys as it chose to honor an album that was considered masterful in its artistry yet morally bankrupt in its values.

Last week, the Recording Academy once again nominated Eminem for album of the year along with nine other bids; and it again gave accolades to a foul but genius piece of work—Cee Lo's "(Expletive) You,"



an infectious retro groove with an unforgettable, unprintable chorus.

The tune, which is so profane it had to be changed to "Forget You" for radio play, was nominated for two top Grammy honors: record and song of the year.


Eminem has been nominated for album of the year, some 10 years after his first album of the year nomination.
