
Ducks play for a national championship

The Oregon Ducks from the PAC 10 conference will face the Auburn Tigers from the SEC conference in the BCS national championship game to be played Monday night Jan. 10

Kick off time from University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, Ariz. is scheduled for 5:20 p.m. ESPN will provide the national television coverage.

Oregon's players have a serious task ahead: facing topranked Auburn and their Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Cam Newton. The second-ranked Ducks are also playing in their first national championship.

Mascots for the Oregon Ducks and Auburn Tigers set the stage for the NCAA college football title. The BCS championship game is scheduled to air on ESPN on Monday, Jan. 10 at 5:30 p.m. A special free broadcast will also take place at the Hollywood Theater on Northeast Sandy Boulevard.

Now comes the biggest week in the program's 115-year history.

Oregon (12-0) had a fairly easy run through the regular season, crushing teams with an uptempo offense that had opponents feigning injuries in an attempt to slow it down. The Ducks had one close game — 15-13 over Cal — and led the nation with 49.3 points per game while averaging nearly 540 yards.
