

Anti-Police Protest Breaks Windows

More than two dozen anti-police be mostly white men, spray-painted protestors took the streets and vandalized a Wells Fargo bank Monday night while protesting four recent officer-involved shootings, including one that killed a man with a knife in southeast Portland on Sunday.

The protesters, who appeared to
