Ship Named After Black Naval Officer

Reflects legacy of officer who broke barriers

The USS Gravely, an Arleigh Burkeclass guided missile destroyer, is the first U.S. Navy ship to be named in honor of an African-American commissioned Naval officer.

Vice Admiral Samuel Lee Gravely Jr. was the first African-American to serve aboard a fighting ship as an officer, the first to command a U.S. Navy ship, the first to serve as a fleet commander and the first to become an admiral.

Gravely was born in Richmond, Va, on June 4, 1922. He enlisted in the Naval Reserves in1942 and was recalled to active duty in 1949. He served his initial assignment in the Washington, DC area, recruiting African Americans into the Navy.

He went on to a have a successful career that lasted 38 years. His personal motto was: "Education, motivation and perseverance are a formula for success."

Gravely's widow, Alma Bernice Clark Gravely, was the sponsor of the ship, the
