2011 Nissan Versa 1.8 SL HB

The 2011 Ford Fiesta is an all-new subcompact available in hatchback and sedan body styles. It's entrylevel car comes as a 4-door sedan or 4-door hatchback. It affordable, safe and now comes with anti-lock brakes.

The SL hatchback has a continuously variable transmission (CVT) that behaves much like an automatic, a segmented belt rides up and down on cone-shaped pulleys to vary the speed ratio between the engine and the drivetrain. The 1.8liter engine produces 122 hp and 127 lb-ft of torque. Its suspension is tuned for a softer ride and for comfort on poor road surfaces. It still allows responsive handling with little body roll in normal driving. The electrically-assisted power steering feels right, it is a little tighter than I would have thought. If you are looking for speed this is not the vehicle for that, but great for everyday driving to get you around.

Every Versa comes standard with front side airbags and side curtain airbags. Antilock brakes are optional on the base car and standard on all other trim levels. Stability and trac-
