### Def Jam contest winner stays schooled

As the winner of the Def Jam Rapstar Get Schooled Video Competition, Yung Mil whose real name is Ezekial "Zeke" Jones, has earned a trip to New York City where he will meet Def Jam execs Russell Simmons and Kevin Liles and perform on BET's 106th and Park.

In his submission to Def Jam's Leaders of the New School contest, Jones impressed viewers with visionary lyrics that empower young people to dream big, stay positive, motivated, and most of all, graduate:

"When I was young I was told to dream big and never big enough, life is what you make it so I'm only trying to live it up, / Diligence should thrive throughout every single new soul, displaying positivity when others fail to do so / We should be going to school, not just blogging on youtube, cause it's up to us to be the leaders of the new school."



Now the skinny-jean-wearing rapper performs solo and juggles a busy life comparable to some of today's rich and famous rap stars.

When he's not expanding his vocabulary in English class, thinking up lyrics on the bus ride home, or performing live at the Parkrose prom, Jones is writing, rapping, dancing, networking, skating, singing "a little" and producing his own music.

"You can compare me to other artists, but I feel like the music that I make is personal, and it's all come from me, inside," said Jones who writes songs about growing up as a teen, having fun, and making money. "I feel like I grow with each song I make as an artist," he said.
