

Shots Fired in Southeast

On Tuesday May 17, 2011, Portland Police Officers arrested a 53-year-old armed man after he fired shots in Southeast Portland in the parking lot of a bar.

Officers from the East Precinct responded to the report of shots fired in the area of 15920 Southeast Division Street, where they located Rudolph Joseph Goldbacher outside of Montego's Bar around 12:30 a.m.

Armed with a handgun, he dropped the firearm before taken into custody by the officers. Police on the scene learned Goldbacher was in the area to purchase narcotics when he got into a dispute with some people, which resulted in him

firing two shots at the other men.

Although nobody was injured or shot, one round impacted the side of an apartment in the Anderson Villa Apartments, and the other went through a fence and into the ground.

Those who were shot at fled the area and have not been located at this time.

Goldbacher is currently being held in Multnomah County Jail after being charged with Possession of Cocaine, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Possession of a Loaded Firearm in the City, Discharge of a Firearm in the City, and Disorderly Conduct in the Second Degree.

Father Arrested for Assault

A Multnomah County Grand Jury will hear testimony this week regarding the arrest of 27-year-old Father on a charge of Assault in the First Degree to his biological child.

On Sunday, May 8th, the Gresham Police Department arrested 26-year-old Roderick Frimpong after being dispatched to 3500 Northeast 17th on the report of a domestic disturbance where a baby was injured.

The 7-month-old baby was transported to an area hospital and currently remains in critical condition.

Once on scene officers called for Detectives from the Portland Police Bureau's Child Abuse Team, which is a Portland Police Bureau lead multi-agency unit with participation from Portland Police Bureau, Gresham Police Department and the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office.

Trump Skips Opts Out

Shuttle Success

After two delays covering 27 days, space shuttle Endeavour began its 25th and final flight in a stunning launch on Monday from the Kennedy Space Center. The Endeavor is the last lift off before the final mission of Atlantis, which is scheduled for mid-July. After this summer, the United States will be unable to send its own astronauts into space without the help of other countries.

Permission to Kill Sea Lions

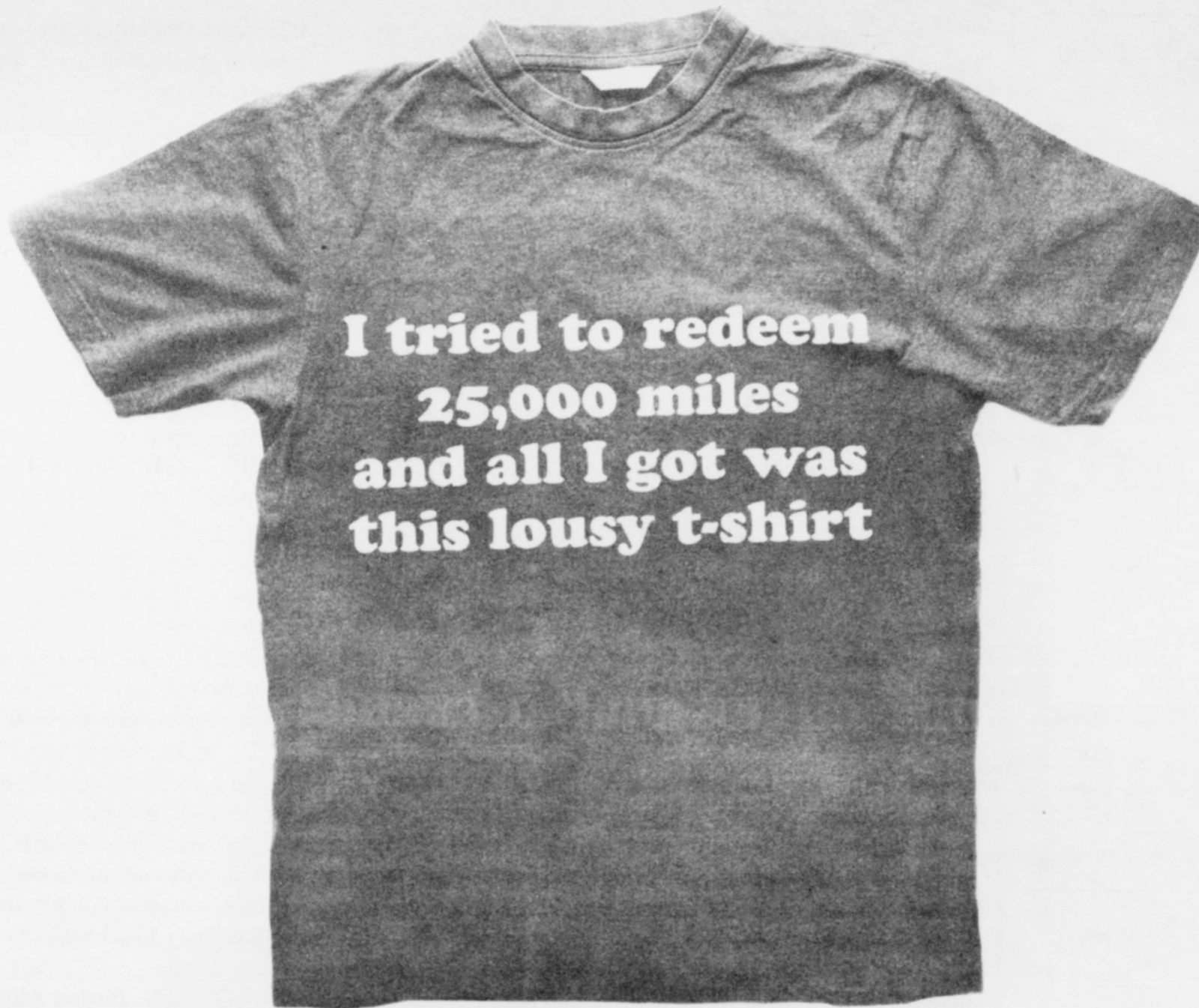
Merely six months after a federal appeals court struck down a similar permit, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration gave permission on Friday to Oregon and Washington to resume removing or killing California sea lions at Bonneville Dam in hopes to help restore salmon and steelhead populations. The California sea lion population is estimated at a healthy 238,000 while wild Columbia River spring Chinook salmon is listed as endangered.

The strategy calls for officials from the State Department, the Pentagon, the Justice Department, the Commerce Department and the Department of Homeland Security to work with their counterparts around the world to come up with standards aimed at preventing theft of private information and ensuring Internet freedom.
