## LOCAL NEWS Steady Job Growth Seen

Unemployment rate finally falls below 10 percent BY MINDY COOPER

After years of double-digit unemployment statistics, Oregon has finally fallen below 10 percent in its unemployment rate for the months of March and April, which could be a positive sign of spring and summer job growth within the Portland community.

According to the Oregon Employment Department, the seasonally adjusted jobless rate fell to 9.6 percent in April, which was the lowest rate since 9.2 percent in December 2008.

As a hovering effect of the recession, the unemployment rate lingered in the mid-10 percent range for almost a year after hitting a high of 11.6 percent in June 2009.

Nick Beleiciks, an employment economist for the state's employment department, explained the 9.6 percent rate is a good sign that
