"I don't know."

Due to more cuts in education and lack of jobs, Dibble will leave Oregon after she completes her degree and teach abroad for the Peace Corps, where she intends to broaden her dream beyond American borders.

Shamari Robertson, accompanying his cousin, a PCC student, said that after high school he planned to become a barber. He began classes at Phagan's School of Hair Design, but was forced to withdraw after unexpectedly failing a test.

Now, believing to have used up his financial aid, Robertson says he will continue his months-long search for a job, hoping to go back to school sometime in the future and get a better job.

"The system has gotten somewhat broken," says 25-year-old Dana Sullivan, a biochemistry student who returned to school after work-

ing an un-fulfilling job as a T-Mobile sales representative out of high school.

Resolute on avoiding loans herself, she said, "Students are getting out of school with degrees that are not high-paying and they have huge debt. It's sad because, they are fed this dream of going to a four year school and can go to the best of the best, but in the end what is it getting you?"

Sullivan plans to transfer to PSU and further pursue a career as an endocrinologist or dietitian at Oregon Health Sciences University, a job she believes to be of high demand.

While some worry about debt and finding a job after graduation, other students feel confident because they have chosen a career in a high demand field like civil engineering and medicine, and expect to get a good-paying job right away.

"It depends on what you're studying and what jobs are avail-

able," said Misty Meisner a nursing major who believes she will have a job after she successfully completes her degree.

One Hispanic-American PCC student offers an alternative voice,

"I am really appreciative of this country; this country has helped me get a job and a place to live," said Jose Martinez, a Mexican native who says he has few worries and little to complain about.

Martinez takes language classes at PCC so he can improve his English and keep his seafood restaurant job where a steady position relies on better communication with employers.

"Americans are brave. They try hard to understand our language and culture," he said. Martinez believes that giving permission to immigrant workers who lack proof of citizenship to work, would allow them to stay and contribute to the U.S. economy, "All that money would stay here and help the economy," he said.
