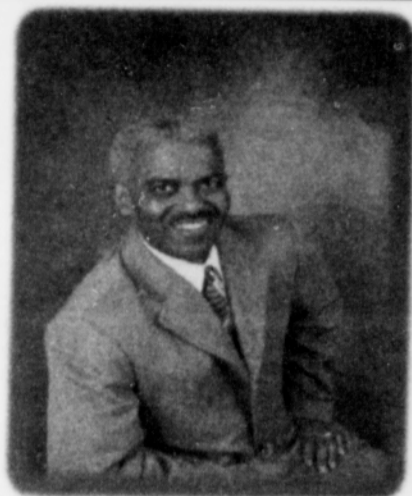
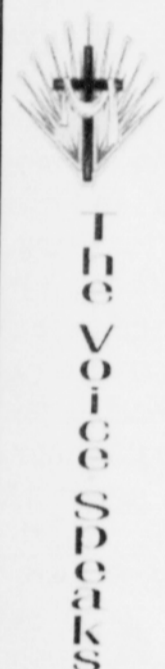

Two Juneteenth Celebrations Saturday

Community members throughout the Portland area will have the opportunity to attend two celebrations this year to commemorate the last hold of slavery being defeated on June 19, 1865, when African Americans first learned they were free.

Jefferson High School will be the host for the annual Juneteenth event which includes a parade that begins at 11 a.m. in front of the Wells Fargo Bank branch on Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and Jarrett Street, ending at Jefferson High.

The free community festival will feature live entertainment, food vendors, a merchant marketplace, information booths and a children's area with storytelling, bounce houses, arts and crafts, and a time table challenge presented by Harriett Tubman Leadership Academy for Young Women.

A second Juneteenth event will take place on the corner of MLK and Alberta on both Saturday, June 18, and Sunday, June 19.

Woody Broadnax, the organizer

of the new event, said the celebration will include a call to action regarding the livability of the community; how we educate; and how we bring about behaviors that lead to a successful future for everybody.

The significance in the celebration of Juneteenth, he said, must include actions, which allow young people of the community to leave more successful in what they do.

"It can't just be a booty shakin' party," he explained. "We need to lift them up. It's for the people."
