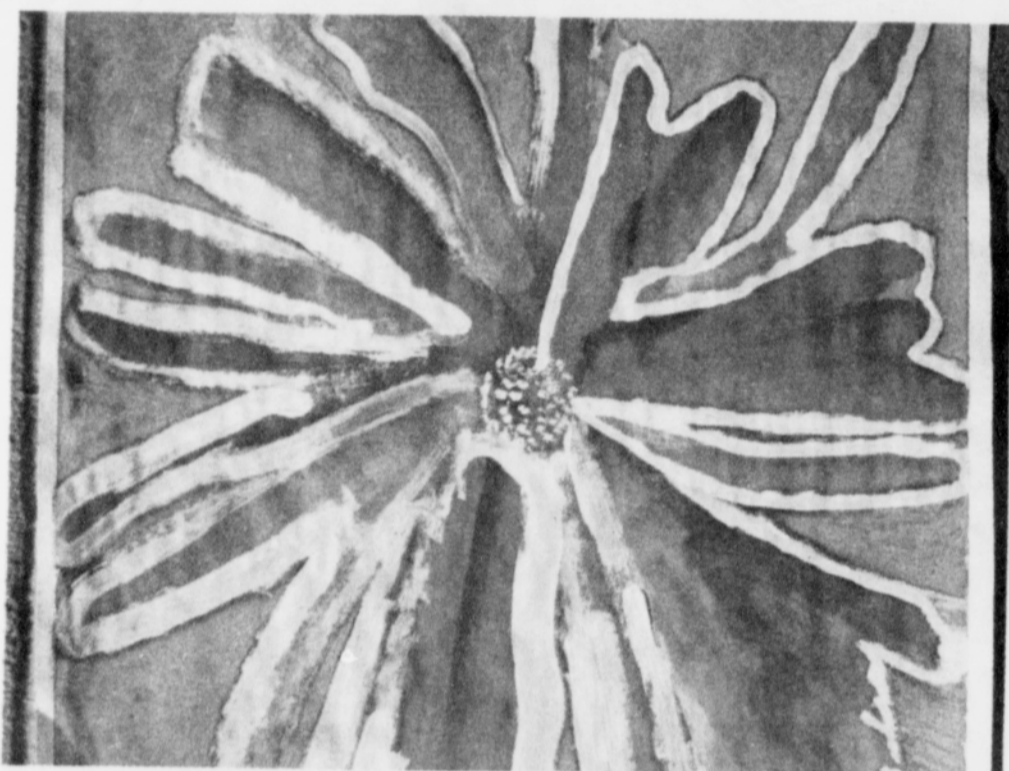

Japanese Summer Festival

Cultural event dedicated to tsunami relief



Natsu Matsuri, a traditional Japanese summer festival centered on Japanese culture and Japanese games, foods, music and dance takes place Saturday, July 2 at Uwajimaya Beaverton Plaza, 10500 S.W. Beaverton-Hillsdale Hwy.

What makes this festival unique is that it is organized by community organizations and non-profits and has no commercial vendors. Further, this year proceeds raised during the festival will be used to help alleviate the suffering of those in Japan affected by Great East Japan Earthquake and Tsunami of 2011.

The focus will be on Japanese music and dance and fun at this family-friendly event, which will feature lots of live Japanese music and odori dancing, many traditional children's games, shaved ice, Japanese and Asian festival foods, a yukata contest, and much, much more.

The festival will be held from 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is free and there is plenty of free parking.
