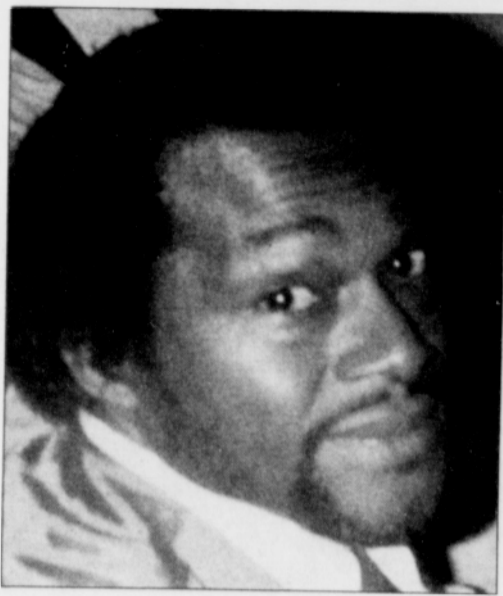
Major H. Lincoln Sr.

He was born in Beaumont, Texas and was educated at Boise Elementary School and Benson High School, Oregon State University in Corvallis, and Wichita State University in Wichita, Kan., where he played football and ran track for their varsity teams.

He had a truly powerful personality with a kind and loving heart. He was a talented and industrious man who taught himself to play the flute. He crafted, sculpted and manufactured jewelry. He loved the Lord and was very spiritual in his own way. He attended Good Samaritan Church of God in Christ and latter fellowshipped at Daniels Memorial Church of God in Christ in Portland before relocating to The Philippines.
