



1-405: Fremont Bridge **Upper Deck Paving Project**

This summer an Oregon Department of Transportation project will replace the pavement on the upper deck (southbound direction) of the Fremont Bridge (Interstate 405).

The project requires three weekends of full closure and at least one weekend of multiple lane closures on the upper deck. There will also be multiple lane closures during weeknights. Use 1-5 south as a detour and expect congestion during the closures.
