
"The boys came out to compete every day," said SEI Midgets Head Coach Anthony Deloney. "They are mentally tougher than many adults I've competed with."

also received the Sportsmanship Award, which is awarded by Junior Baseball umpires, score keepers and tournament staff, for exemplary behavior on and off the field, which they said is shared by players, parents, coaches and fans.
