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

Mayor decides to focus on job at hand

Portland Mayor Sam Adams announced Friday he will not seek reelection for a second term because he wouldn't be able to work on his agenda and run a successful campaign simultaneously.

"As I have considered the reality of a possible re-election effort, I have come to the conclusion that I have a choice: Move this agenda forward, or campaign full-time for re-election," he said in a letter addressed to the public. "With the state of our nation in such flux, and so many local issues needing focused and hands-on mayoral leadership, for me, the choice is clear."

2008 election made Portland the largest city to have a gay mayor at the time, made the announcement twoyears after he admitted his dishonesty about having sexual relations with a teenage legislative aide.

"I am under no illusion of how challenging the race for re-election would be," he said.

Both Charlie Hales, a former city Adams, whose victory in the commissioner, and Eileen Brady, a co-founder of New Seasons Grocery stores, had previously announced their plans to challenge the mayor.




