## Film and Music for the Big Screen

### Reel Music Festival opens this weekend

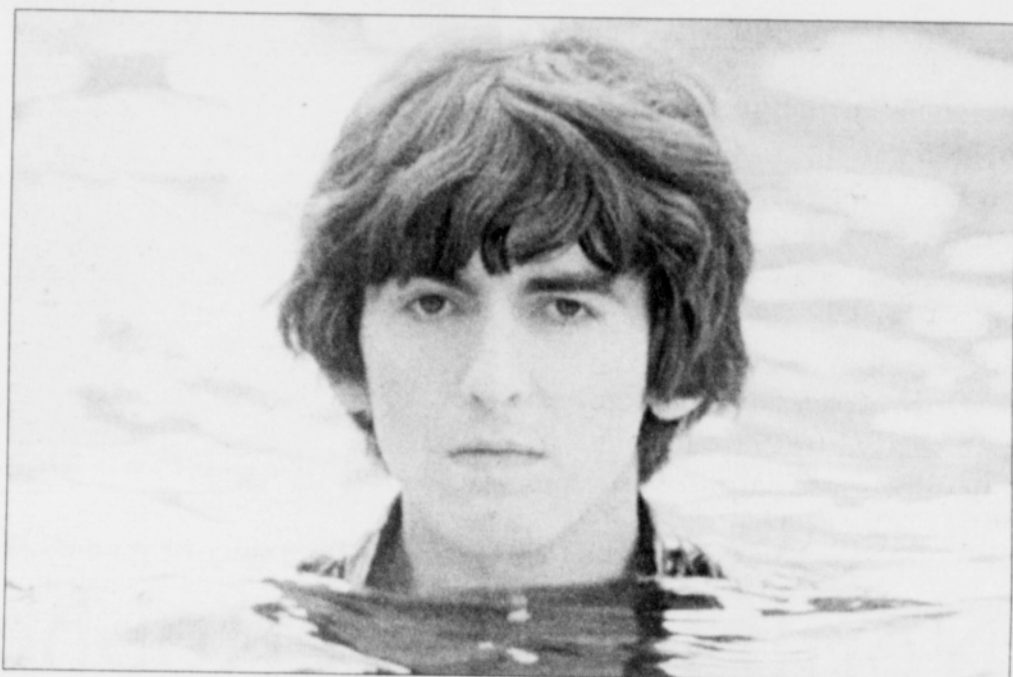
The Northwest Film Center's Reel Music Festival, spotlighting the intersections of film and music through music-related short films, documentaries, and music videos, returns for its 29th year.

Formerly a mainstay of the January arts and cultural calendar, Reel Music moves to October this year to accommodate its growth and increasing popularity. Screenings take place beginning Friday, Oct 7 through Sunday, Oct. 23.

The opening night film is a new biopic about one of the world's most beloved musicians, directed by a filmmaking legend: Martin Scorsese's *George Harrison: Living in the Material World*, which screens on Friday at 7 p.m. in the Film Center's Whitsell Auditorium.

Scorsese weaves together never-before-seen material, including interviews with Harrison and his closest friends, performances, home movies, and photographs, resulting in a rare glimpse into the mind and soul of an extraordinarily talented artist.

Other Reel Music highlights include: This is Noise Pop, an explo-

ration of the genesis of indie rock; That was Then, This is Now: Portland Music Videos, juxtaposing vintage and current music videos from some of Portland's most talented bands; and Searching for Elliott Smith, tracing the late Portland

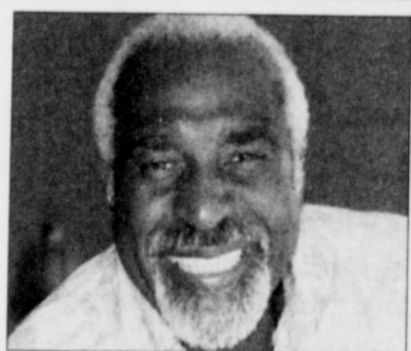

## Multicultural Film Festival Kick-Off

The year's 11th annual Multicultural Film Festival goes to the heart of race and the contentious interactions in which we sometimes find ourselves.

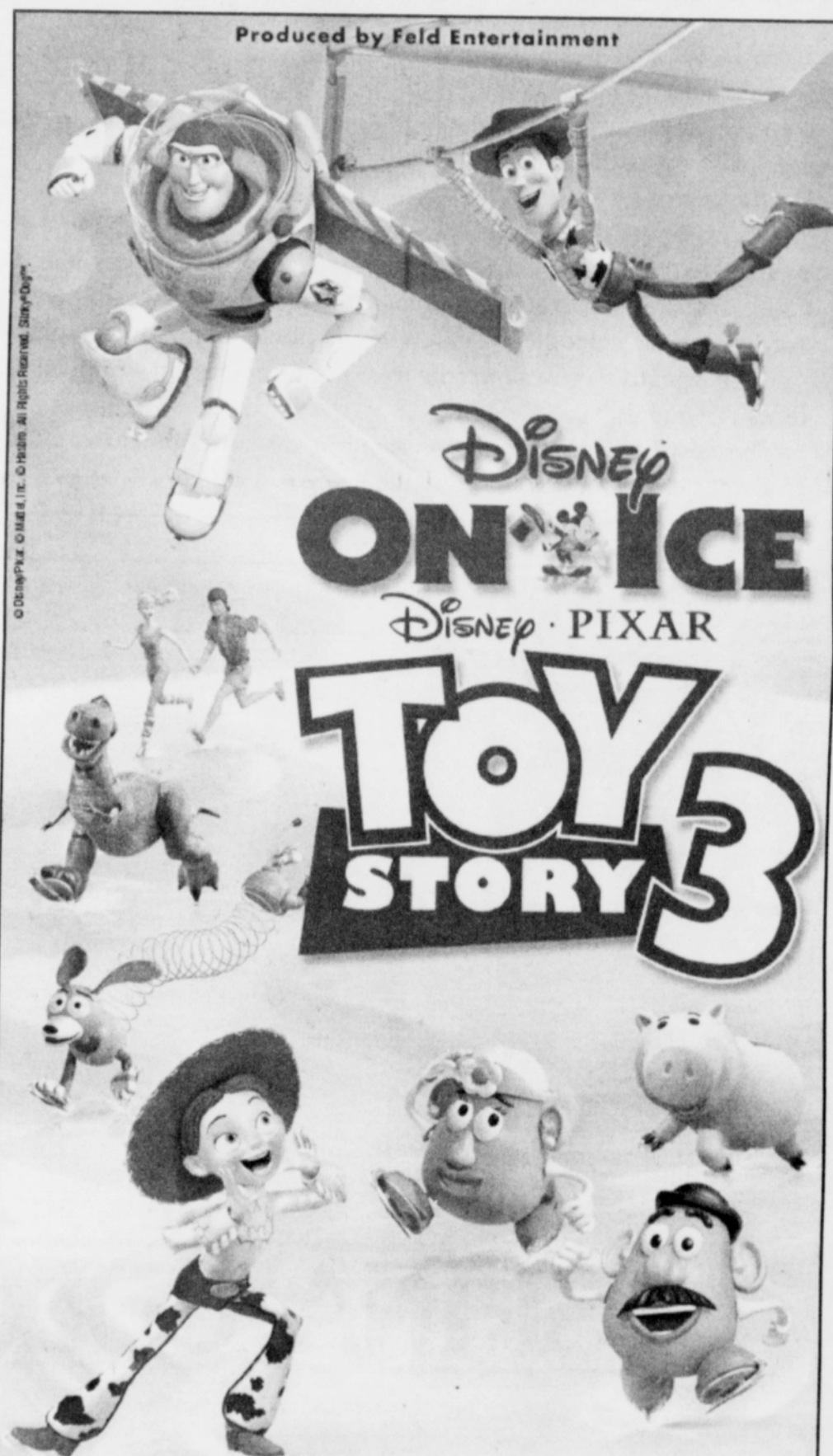
